- Maintaining contacts with the respective donors and collaborate closely with the regional and country offices and the technical advisors in assessing
- funding opportunities, project ideas and developing proposalsDevelop the donor portfolio (Focus International)
- Close cooperation with the other institutional fundraising departments as well as the project managers in the implementation and reporting on the funded projects
- Close cooperation with CBM initiatives
- Contribute to the development and setup of the infrastructure for new donors
